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2nd Sunday in Ord. Time B From the Pastor's desk Jan.14, 2024

Today's readings are all about vocation. The thought is that God calls particular people from among their fellows and families to do something special task in His plan of salvation. In our first reading the young altar-boy Samuel is awaken by the call by God, to serve the Lord in a new way as prophet, priest and judge (1 Sam 3:3-10, 19).

It is inspiring. But the risk of hearing stories like that of Samuel, is that we think vocation is some voice telling us what to do with our lives, if only we strain our ears hard enough to hear it; some puzzle we can solve, if only we engage in a sufficiently convoluted discernment process of spiritual somersaults. Most people, in fact, discover what they are made for in a less dramatic way, by thinking through for themselves what they are best at, what makes them happy, how best they might serve, while always being open to a wisdom higher than their own. Of course, the initiative in vocation lies with God, who graces our minds with insights and prompts our hearts with desires beyond our own.

We are called to hold our faith strong. We have seen what happened last years between Russia and Ukraine or the Hama- Palestinians and Israel. We have to be careful and prayerful this year. How things are going now, political tension and presidential election, we have to watchful, but in this time or an age of militant secularism and Islamist terrorism, not just in places like Syria, Mali, Columbia and Nigeria but "closer to home" with home grown terrorists, we Christians must take real risks in holding out the hand of friendship to others. And we must be true to our Gospel that offers a different wisdom to "greed is good and control is contentment", even if fidelity to that Gospel costs us deeply.

As Christian we have to strong in our faith and vocations. Faith does not promise us freedom from tribulation, but courage and grace to face the trials yet to come. And in this respect, it is true to say that every Christian has a vocation, not just those joined to a spouse in marriage or a Church in priesthood or religious life. By faith every Christian is called out of the world that honors gold and the sword, consumerism and terrorism, over life and love and ideals. By Baptism every Christian is given a mission to be a temple of the Holy Spirit (1Cor 6:13-20) and to live the adventure of the Gospel wherever it leads, building up the Church's holiness and contributing to humanity's quest for happiness. We call this vocation "the priesthood of all the faithful" (cf 1Pet 2:9) and we each express it in different ways – though sadly not always as well as we might.

In this New Year of grace 2015, as our New Year's resolutions inevitably fall by the wayside, perhaps we might try to hold onto this one holy resolve: to live my Christian vocation a little better and say to God speak Lord your servant is listening.

PASTOR'S CORNER FOR 2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME.

As we begin the Ordinary Time today, the readings of today are an invitation and a call to a particular vocation or ministry. The two disciples asked our Lord Jesus where he is staying. Instead of giving them an answer, Jesus says, "Come and you will see."

Faith functions much like this: we wish to know where we are ultimately headed and what heaven is like, but the only option is to experience it.

Jesus' response is one of action and inclusion: instead of giving the disciples a name where he lives and leaving them to determine the directions, Our Lord Jesus invites them to come along with him. Have you ever shared your encounter with Jesus with friends and family member?

What would you do in this situation, if you encountered the Messiah and could simply ask where he was going? Would you follow? Would you ask for time to pack? Would you give your job two weeks' notice?

Too often we keep these experiences to ourselves, worried what other people may think or say of us or afraid we won't say the right word.

Andrew did not hesitate to share his own experience with his brother Simon Peter. Samuel was not afraid to answer God calling him and sharing his experience with Eli who advised him on what to answer.

Andrew brings Simon to Jesus. He gives him the opportunity to meet the Lord and experience the love of God. There are many ways we can bring other people to Christ Jesus. These two simples, yet life-changing, acts undertaken by Andrew had a meaningful impact not only on Simon's life but also the life of the entire Church.

Through that invitation, Simon Peter was able to lead the apostles and to lead the young Church in the midst of trials, tribulations and persecutions. We shouldn't underestimate what marvels God can work through our openness to share God with others as Andrew did to his brother Simon and the young Samuel going to Eli to answer and to share his experience.

Even though we experience Christ and the Church in our own age and time, it's good practice to imagine what our reaction might have been if we were the disciples in Palestine. In many ways we are. Wherever you are, you are asked to invite others to the Lord for them to experience Him. Are willing to do so?
